

When Jesus spoke to the churches in Revelation,

He addressed seven ministry leaders in seven cities where the early church had taken root. Jesus began by saying to each individual church, "To the angel of the church of..." (v. 1). The word 'angel' in the text could have been translated 'messenger' as it was in other places. The messenger to each of the churches referred to the leader or pastor of each church.

All of these churches were located in what was then Asia Minor. Today, they are all in western Turkey which is truly the Cradle of Christianity.


In 2008, I had the privilege of traveling to 5 of the 7 cities as part of a research team with my good friend Rick Renner. We stayed 5 days in Colosse, and from there we went to each of these cities.

Jesus' message to each church is so relevant to the churches and leaders today. One of the most eye-opening discoveries for me was when we went to the ruins of Laodicea. While excavation was not complete, we could clearly see the city center with its thousand-meter-long main street made of large marble slabs. The street was lined by sidewalk arcades on each side laid with mosaic tiles and filled with hundreds of shops. Laodicea was a very wealthy city.

It was located on the route connecting Rome with Persia; consequently, there was constant traffic that produced great wealth through commerce and trade.

While I stood on the acropolis of the city, Jesus' statement from Revelation came to life. "I know your works, that you are neither cold or hot. So then, because you are lukewarm, and neither cold nor hot, I will vomit you out of my mouth" (Rev. 3:15-16).

Having been there, I saw that several ancient aqueducts had been built from the famous hot mineral pools of Hierapolis all of the way across the Lycos Valley to the city of Laodicea.

The rich Laodiceans did not want to travel six miles to soak in the pools of Hierapolis, so they paid laborers to build aqueducts that brought some of those "healing waters" to their city.

Of course, by the time the hot water traveled across the valley it went from hot water to lukewarm and useless. The lukewarm water brought none of the healing properties with it.

Continuing to address this church, Jesus said "you are neither hot nor cold." Jesus was referring to the cool river fed by the melting snow coming off the nearby mountaintops. The river brought the cold waters that would refresh anyone on even the hottest day.

Healing and refreshing.
Jesus has paid the price
to bring both healing and
refreshing to anyone who will
receive them. He has provided His healing power and
refreshing presence for every
person, and the church is the
vessel for this ministry.

The message was clear, these Christians in Laodicea were not bringing the ministry of Jesus to anyone. What had once been a voice of help and healing had become a church organization without the power or presence they were designed to possess. They were lukewarm and nauseating.

We can certainly learn and benefit from this rebuke. Remember, Jesus does not condemn people, but He does correct. This was a very powerful and pointed correction for the Laodiceans, and we need to hear it today.

Our assignment is more than to receive the goodness of God. Like Jesus, we are also to reveal the goodness of God.

The gifts of His Spirit within us bring powerful results. The fruit born within each of us reveals the love of God in its many variations. These are all to be active in our lives.

God is raising up this generation to walk in greater power to bring healing and refreshing to people. We must make the decision to be His vessels who are both hot with healing and cold with refreshing.

Jesus also addressed the church at Philadelphia. His message to this church was very different. "He who has the key of David, He who opens and no one shuts, and shuts and no one opens..." (Rev. 3:7–8).

Although He went on the say their strength was small, He commended them for not wavering.

"I know all that you've done. Now I have set before you a wide-open door that none can shut. For I know that you possess only a little power, yet you've kept my word and haven't denied my name" (v. 8 TPT).

The Philadelphia believers kept a guard over their hearts and stood against the corrupt culture around them. They did not let go of their identity in Christ, nor run from the pressures they faced. They stood up to persecution and pressure as believers.

Denying Jesus can take on several meanings which are all very relevant to us.

For example there are some, not many, who have been Christians and turned totally away from their faith. They have rejected Jesus and apologize for leading others astray. While that is nearly impossible to fathom, Jesus warned us that some would be deceived. Don't let your love for Him grow cold.

and influence in Christ. They hold the line and are not giving up the ground they have obtained by faith.


The Spirit is blowing the wind of His Word through the church. Each of us in the church have the door opened
